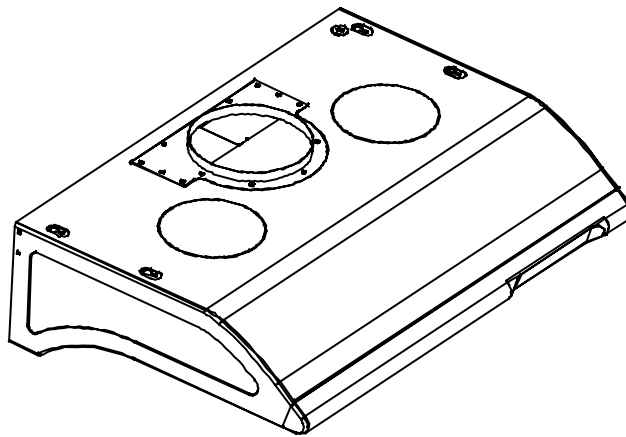

- f. Use high setting on hood only when necessary.
- g. Don't leave hood unattended when cooking.
- h. Always use cookware and utensils appropriate for the type of and amount of food being prepared.

Maximum Duct Length: For satisfactory air movement, the total duct length of a 3 1/4" x 10" rectangular, 6" or 7" diameter round duct should not exceed 100 equivalent feet.



Minimum mount height between range top to hood bottom should be no less than 24".

Maximum mount height should be no higher than 32".

It is important to install the hood at the proper mounting height. Hoods mounted too low could result in heat damage and fire hazard; while hoods mounted too high will be hard to reach and will lose its performance and efficiency.

If available, also refer to range manufacturer's height clearance requirements and recommended hood mounting height above range. Always check your local codes for any differences.

Minimum Duct Size:

Round- 7" minimum

Rectangular- 3-1/4 x 10" minimum
(rear or top)

DUCTING

A minimum of 7" round or 3-1/4 x 10" rectangular duct must be used to maintain maximum air flow efficiency.

Always use rigid type metal ducts only. Flexible ducts could restrict air flow by up to 50%.

Use calculation worksheet to compute total duct work.

ALWAYS, when possible, reduce the number or transitions and turns. If long duct run is required, increase duct size from 7" to 8". If a reducer is used, install a long reducer instead of a pancake reducer. Reduce duct size as far away from opening as possible.

If turns or transitions are required:
Install as far away from opening and as far apart, between 2, as possible.

DAMAGE-SHIPMENT / INSTALLATION:

- Please fully inspect unit for damage before installation.
- If the unit is damaged in shipment, return the unit to the store in which it was bought for repair or replacement.
- If the unit is damaged by the customer, repair or replacement is the responsibility of the customer.
- If the unit is damaged by the installer (if other than the customer), repair or replacement must be made by arrangement between customer and installer.

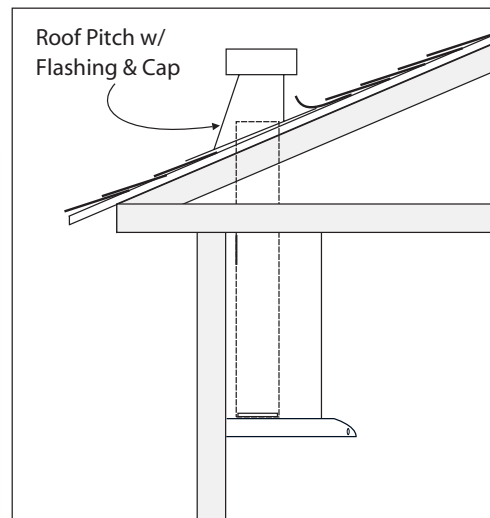
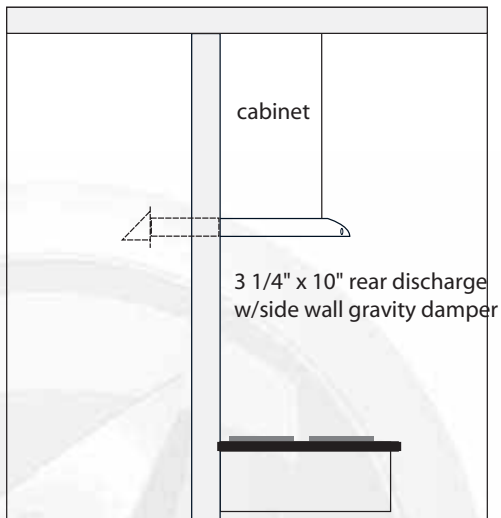
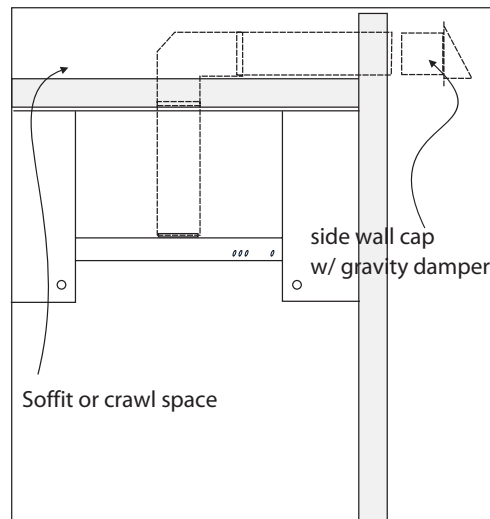
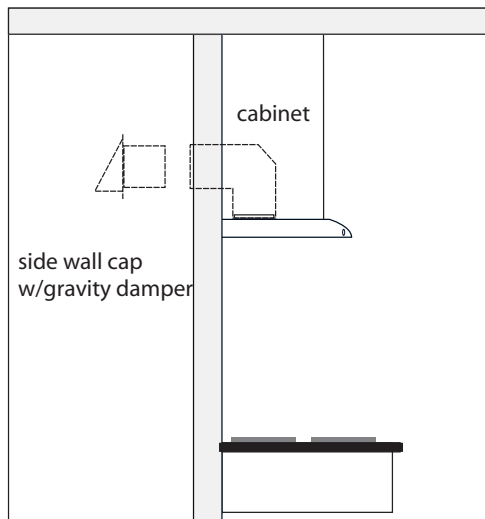
WARNING FIRE HAZARD

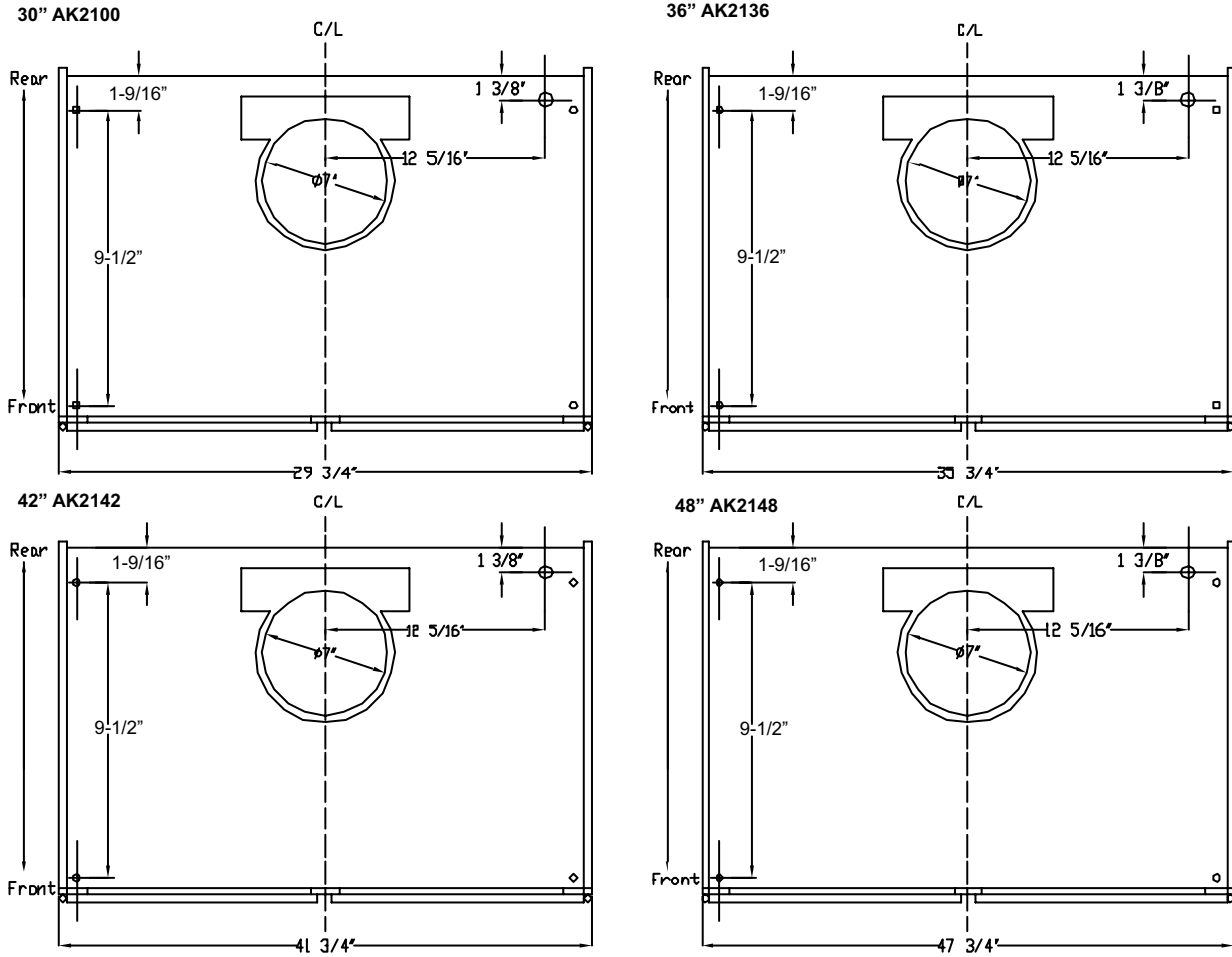
NEVER exhaust air or terminate duct work into spaces between walls, crawl spaces, ceiling, attics or garages. All exhaust must be ducted to the outside, unless using the recirculating option.

Use single wall rigid Metal ductwork only.

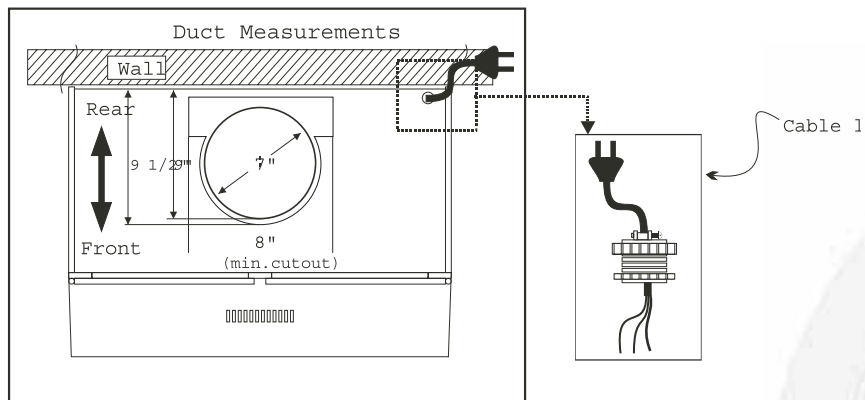
Fasten all connections with sheet metal screws and tape all joints w/ certified Silver Tape or DuctTape.

* Dimensions for electrical knockout and mounting holes are the same for all units.



Cable Lock:

A cable locking connector (not supplied) might also required by local codes. Check with local requirements and codes, purchase and install appropriate connector if necessary.

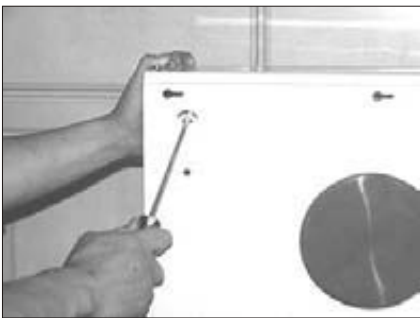
Installation - Installing the hood



1. Remove all contents from box. Unscrew and remove bottom grease splash shield.



2. Locate electrical connection box inside. Unscrew cover to reveal wiring.



3. Locate electrical connection box knock out from left rear of hood and pry open with screwdriver.



4. Cut out cabinet base opening if necessary.





5. Reinforce cabinet base with 1x2 wood strips if additional strengthening is required. Unscrew and remove bottom grease splash shield.



6. Install damper if required by local codes (not provided), or install 6" starting collar (green).**



7. Lift hood to bottom of cabinet



8. Support hood to place, fasten both rear with screws and washer provided.

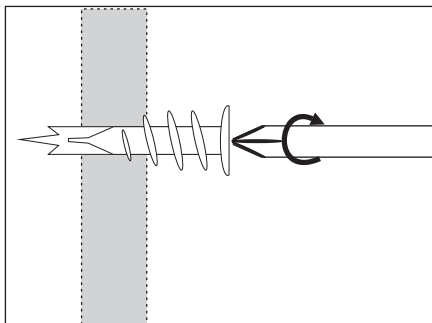


9. Fasten front of hood. Level all sides and adjust accordingly.**



10. Drill out cabinet base through electrical box with 3/4" boring bit.

EZ ANCHORS



Tap EZ anchor tip into marked drywall locations, turn with screwdriver until seated flush.

Note: Whenever possible, the hood should be secured to wall studs. Use EZ anchors only on hollow drywall applications (minimum drywall thickness 1/2"). If a stud or wood surface is present, fasten anchors with screws directly into stud or plywood. For all other wall types (concrete, brick, tiles, etc), use appropriate anchors for mounting.

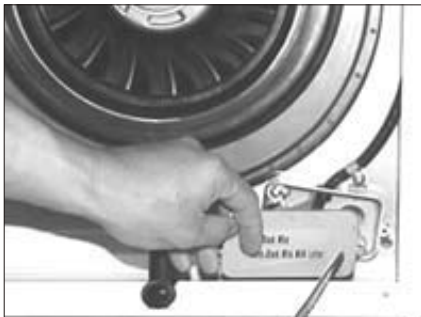
ELECTRICAL CONNECTION



11. Pull electrical supply wire through drill out or use #14 grounded wire for receptacles (not supplied).



12. Connect both wires (blk) on hood to either power supply (blk or wht). Ground green wire.**



13. Reinstall electrical box cover.



14. Reinstall bottom splash shield by first fastening 3 rear screws, (do not tighten all the way).

ELECTRICAL - WARNING

All Electrical work must be performed by qualified electrician or person with similar technical know how and background.

For personal safety, remove house fuse or open circuit breaker before beginning installation.

Do not use extension cord or adapter plug with this appliance.

Follow National electrical codes or prevailing local codes and ordinances.

Electrical Supply:

This appliance requires a 120V 60Hz electrical supply, and connected to an individual, properly grounded branch circuit, protected by a 15 or 20 ampere circuit breaker or time delay fuse. Wiring must be 2 wire w/ ground. Please refer to Electrical Diagram labeled on product.



15. Next, fasten the 3 front screws and begin tightening all screws from rear to front.



16. Connect duct to opening, inspect and tape all joints with approved aluminum or duct tape.



17. Turn on electrical supply or plug into receptacles.

Zephyr series are equipped with the option of a 7" vertical discharge, 3 1/4"x10" vertical discharge, or 3 1/4"x10" rear discharge. Additional accessories are provided to convert to either of the above discharge methods.

Note: hood is pre configured for 7" vertical discharge.

3 1/4"x10" Vertical Discharge

1. Remove pre-mounted 7" transition adaptor or duct opening.



2. Place rectangular transition adaptor as shown by first installing 4 screws on half round section.



3. Mount the 3-1/4"x10" starting collar on top of transition piece with remaining screws.

3 1/4" x 10" Rear Discharge



1. At rear of range hood, remove all screws on premounted rear rectangular cap and remove cap with gasket.



2. Remove top premounted transition piece.



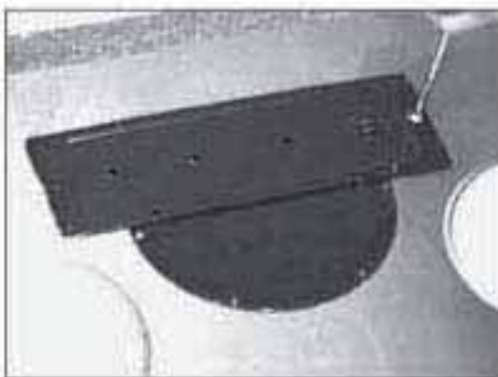
3. Remove diverter blocks through top opening.



4. Mount starting collar (provided) at rear discharge opening with gasket previously removed.

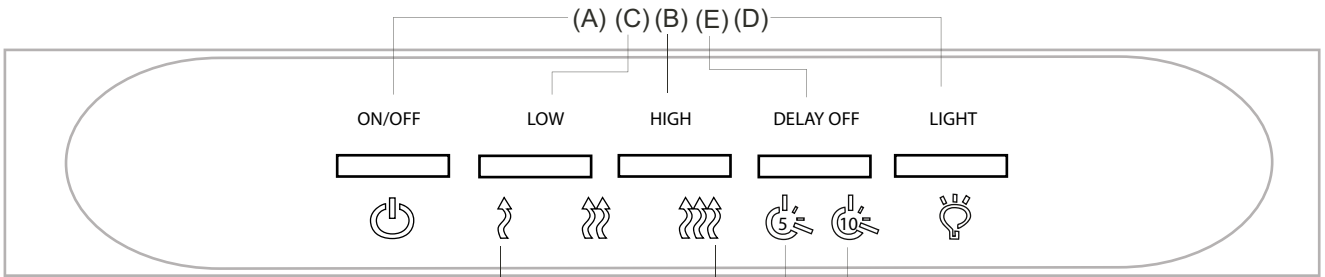


5. Mount rectangular transition piece at opening.



6. Mount rectangular cap (previously removed) on top of transition adaptor. Seal all open holes with duct tapes.

 Level 5 - Indicator 3 flashing
 Level 6 (high) - Indicator 3 lit

- (A) turn hood on/ off
- (B) adjust to higher speed level (1 to 6)

Blower Controls

Turn on the blowers by pressing "on/off" once.

Adjust level of speed (1 to 6) by pressing "high" or "low".

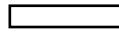
The speed indicator will show the speed the blowers are operating at as follow:

- Level 1(low) -Indicator 1 flashing
- Level 2 - Indicator 1 lit
- Level 3 - Indicator 2 flashing
- Level 4 - Indicator 2 lit
- Level 5 - Indicator 3 flashing
- Level 6 (high) - Indicator 3 lit

Note: The control is equipped with a speed setting memory module. When turning on the blowers, the speed level will start at the speed setting last memorized.

SELF CLEAN FEATURE

All Zephyr model AK2100, AK2136, AK2142, AK2148 hoods are filter-less and designed with a self clean feature. The centrifugal blower system automatically liquifies cooking residue accumulated in its internal housing. All systems are equipped with dishwasher safe clean cups for its self clean function.

Cooking residue are often automatically liquified and can accumulate in the clean cups from everyday use. Nevertheless, grease from cooking could also dry and adhere in its internal housing. Running the self clean function periodically will flush out accumulated residue in the range hood's internal housing.

CLEANING FREQUENCY

Cleaning should be approximately once a month under normal use.

DETERGENT

Grease cutting detergent.

CLEANING

Safety Grill

Remove both safety grills for cleaning by simply removing Philips screws. Clean safety grills in dishwasher under normal wash cycle.

Warning

Use extreme caution as both safety grills are removed. Beware of blowers catching on to hair, loose clothing, and fingers. NEVER leave children unattended.

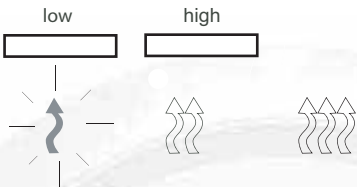
Self Clean

Turn both blowers on lowest speed for cleaning.

Set timed delay off to 5 minutes as indicated.

Maintenance - Cleaning

With nozzle on “spray” squirt detergent directly onto blower blades 30 - 35 times.

Repeat with second blower. Allow self cleaning to complete in 5 minutes (if desired, spray water to rinse off detergent after completion of the cleaning cycle and run another few minutes).

Remove residue cups. Clean w/mild detergent or in dishwasher under normal wash cycle.

Cleaning Tip:

Fill residue cups 1/4 full with water before cleaning or during regular use. This will help to prevent residue from drying and tacking on cup surface



Surface Maintenance:

Clean periodically with hot soapy water and clean cotton cloth. Do not use corrosive or abrasive detergent , or steel wool/scouring pads which will scratch and damage surface.

For heavier soil use liquid degreaser.

After cleaning, you may use non-abrasive stainless steel polish/ cleaners, to polish and buff out the stainless luster and grain Always scrub lightly, with clean cotton cloth, and with the grain.

Do not use any product containing chlorine bleach. Do not use “orange” cleaners.

REPLACING LIGHT BULBS

CAUTION: Light bulb becomes extremely hot when turned on. DO NOT touch bulb until switched off and cooled. Touching hot bulbs could cause serious burns.

Light bulbs (included) are 35W halogen GU-10.

Remove by turning light bulb counter clockwise. Use a suction cup or rubber latex glove if removing the bulb is difficult.

| 1. Upon completion of installation nothing works. | Check if unit has been plugged in, make sure that all power has been turned back on and all electrical wiring are properly connected. |
| 2. Light is on but blowers are not turning at all or seems to be scraping on something. | Blower blade unit might have been mounted too low and scraping the bottom or jammed. Loosen hex screw on blade unit and adjust to proper height. |
| 3. When blowers are on, something seems to be loose and spinning around inside. | There might have been foreign particles left within the discharge opening or rocks, leaves, branches, etc. that might have fell in from old duct work. Disconnect duct work to inspect and remove any foreign particles. |
| 4. Vibration when blowers are on | Unit might not have been secured properly on cabinet. Or cabinet might need to be further secured into studs on wall. |
| 5. Blowers noise | Our blowers are designed to perform up to 850 cfm. A properly functioning motor itself should be relatively quiet. Nevertheless, due to vacuum created by the suction, noise level up to 6 sones will be generated when both blower unit is turned on at its maximum speed. Employing low speeds will suffice moderate cooking such as steaming, broiling etc. |
| 6. Light is not working | Light bulb might need to be replaced. On some instances, the fragile bulb could have been damaged during the shipping process. Replace light bulb. |
| 7. No grease is collected in the clean cups | Grease flow will vary by the amount, methods and types of cooking. If pan-frying is frequent accompanied by steaming, vapor from steam will liquefy accumulated grease in its internal housing and flows in the clean cups. No grease collected in the residue containers is normal until the self clean function is completed. Clean blowers approximately once a month as instructed to avoid clogging. |
| 8. No grease is collected in the residue containers after self cleaning. | Tubes connected to the internal housing might have been clogged due to lack of cleaning. Or hood might not have been leveled when installed. Unclog tubes or re-install hood. |
| 9. Safety grill are dirty | The self clean feature cleans only the internal housing within the range hood. Remove safety grill to clean in dishwasher and clean all surface periodically as instructed. |
| 10. Blowers seemed weak | Check duct size used, duct size should be at least 7". Range hood WILL NOT function properly with the insufficient duct size. Check if duct is clogged or if damper unit is not opening properly. A tight mesh on a side wall cap unit might also cause restriction to the air flow. Use a damper type sidewall cap. Reduce the number of elbows and length of duct work or increase duct size. Check if all joints are properly connected, sealed and taped. |
| 11. Cooking fumes and smoke dissipates before it reaches the blower. | Check if unit is installed at the recommended height. The range hood should also be able to cover the entire cooking area from left to right and most areas from rear to front. Open doors and windows might also distract air flow before it reaches the blowers. Make sure blowers are on high speed for heavy cooking. |

When product is used commercially or other than its intended purpose. Damaged because of improper connection with equipment of other manufacturers. Repaired or modified by anyone other than Zephyr's Authorized Agents.

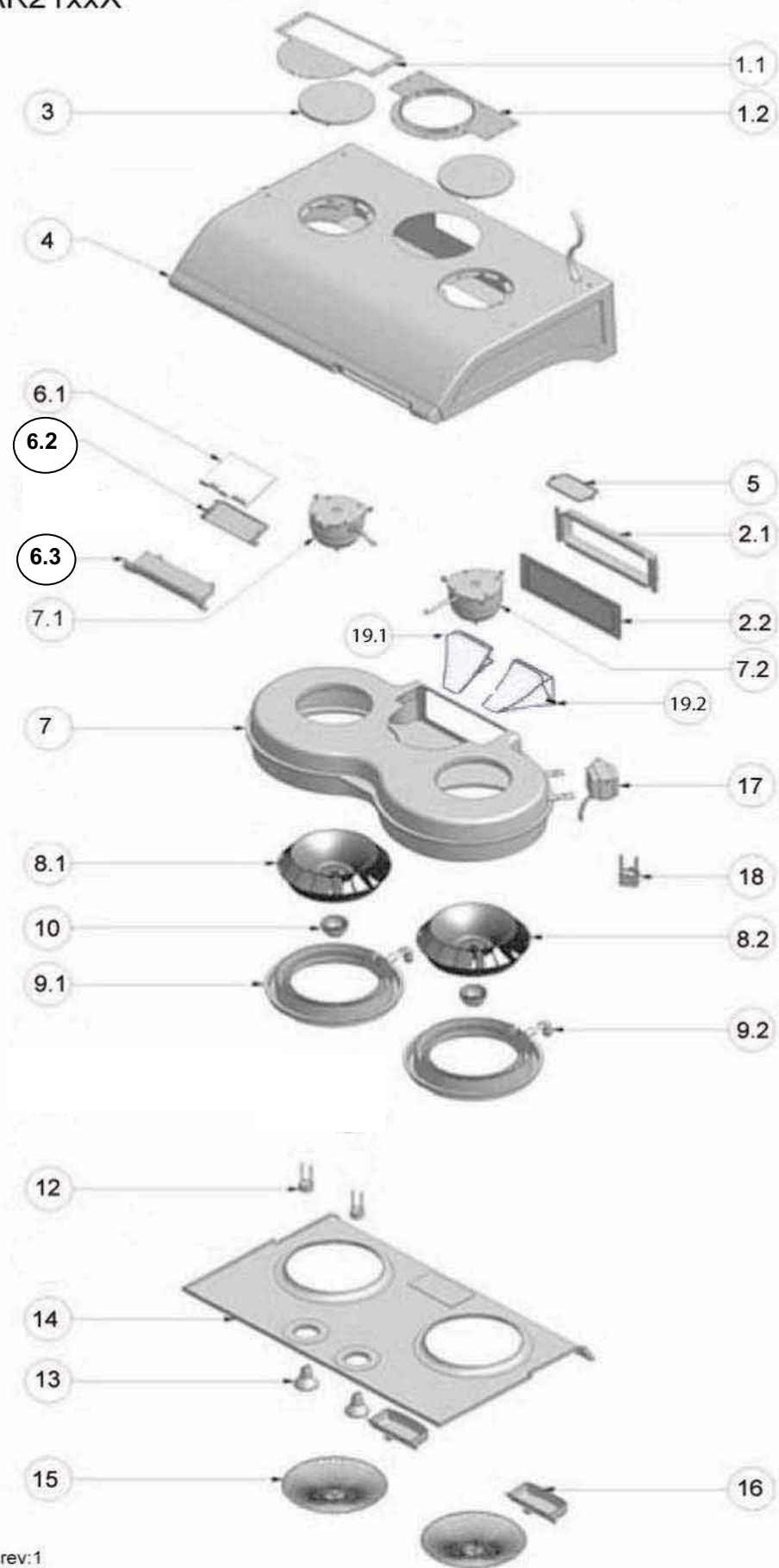
